Domestic Violence during the World Cup - With the World Cup underway, we wanted to make you aware of the increased risk of domestic abuse during major football fixtures and the impact on children.

Key Points

Domestic abuse incidents can increase by 26% when England play and up to 38% if they lose, with risk continuing into the following day.

Recent data also shows a 13% rise in domestic abuse-related 999 calls on match days.

Children

Under the Domestic Abuse Act 2021, children who see, hear, or experience domestic abuse are victims in their own right.

These periods can increase risk and harm within the home.

Local Context

Cranstoun Wakefield are providing support and awareness during the tournament.

Operation Encompass continues to highlight the immediate impact of incidents on children, with notifications shared with schools. If school receives a notification, a member of the DSL Team will make contact to offer support.
