Dear Parents and Carers,



Firstly, a warm welcome back to everyone from, what I hope has been, a wonderful Summer break for you all. I would like to welcome our new families and Reception children to our school.

School Uniform, Equipment and Lunchtimes - The children have returned to school looking very smart and proud in their school uniforms. Please could you take the time to make sure your child's full name is included in all items of school uniform and their belongings. It is always surprising how quickly our lost property boxes get full of unnamed uniform. Each day, your child will need to bring their water bottle filled with still water only. We do not allow juice, fizzy drinks or flavoured water. Infant children will require their book bag daily. Children in Year 3 and 4 will also require their school reading books in school every day.



OPAL – A reminder that at playtimes and lunchtimes, the children have access to outdoor play equipment. This is available to the children in all weathers. Please do not send your children to school in expensive coats as there is a risk that they will get dirty or even damaged. We are pleased to have developed our OPAL play further recently with some wooden teepees having been built and some small world areas for the children to use during playtimes.

Adult Helpers – We are always appreciative of any help we receive in school and are always looking for more to support children with their learning. If you would like to volunteer, please contact the school office.



Parking – As we start the new school year, can I take this opportunity to remind you that we politely ask that you, including additional family relatives who may do school runs, do not park at the top of school on Church Road or in the staff carpark. Church Road is the road directly at the top of school, in front of the church. This is a private road and, due to children crossing, it is an unsafe place to park at the beginning and end of the school day. The school bus has permission to block the entrance to Church Road both at the start and end of the school day to ensure a safer crossing for the school children.

We also ask that you are respectful of residents of the village and are particularly respectful of driveways.

Parent Handbook- I would urge all parents and carers to take notice of the 2025-2026 information contained in our Parent/Carer Handbook which is available on our website (hard copies are available from the office on request) particularly in relation to absences, belongings, uniform requirements, jewellery, make-up, hairstyles, medication/health problems, use of photographic images etc.

Just a reminder, children are not permitted to bring mobile phones to school or wear any kind of SMART watches, this also includes FitBits.



Medication – Up-to-date information will be required for medication sent into school. Please see details in the Parent/Carer Handbook regarding medication in school. Please also ensure inhalers are in date. If your child no longer requires an inhaler, please put this in writing so our records can be kept up to date.

Safeguarding – Many people will be sharing ‘back to school’ photographs on social media.

Please remember:

- Hide/blur out the school logo
- Ensure only your child's face is in the photo
- Do not include personal details for example house numbers, school name, street names, etc.

Some information you put in the caption may be more harmful than you know.

Help our children WalkSafe in Wakefield - Are you aware of WalkSafe+? It's a free app to give families peace of mind that our children are safe when out and about in the district.

Whether they're going to school, the shops or a friend's, there are safety features for every trip. They include:

- WalkSafe, so you can see their route and estimated arrival time
- HomeSafe, which will alert you if they haven't got home on time
- Safety Map, full of safe spaces your children can go to if they're worried
- SOS button, to immediately alert you that they're in danger
- Community reporting, so they can avoid places that feel unsafe



Wakefield have partnered with WalkSafe to add local information to the app, so your children can get help at the touch of a button.

You can download WalkSafe onto [Apple](#) and [Android](#) smartphones. The app is location based, but you can remove permission to track your location at any time in your phone's settings.
